Materuni Waterfalls & Coffee Tour from \$100

You'll set off after breakfast and make your way to the village of Materuni in the Kilimanjaro foothills. As a truly local village, it will provide a great view into the real Tanzania.

You'll start with a tour of a local coffee plantation, learning how coffee is grown and even trying your hand at roasting and grinding your own.







You'll then take a guided walk to Materuni Waterfall. Your walk takes you through local fruit and vegetable plantations, and your guide will tell you about the local culture along the way.

Finish your day trip with a refreshing dip in the waterfall pool and a delicious picnic lunch before heading back to your hotel in Arusha.

Arusha Coffee Tour from \$50





You will start the day by visiting a local organic and Fair Trade coffee farm in Nkoaranga Village, 25km east of Arusha. Your local guide will show you the village and tell vou about its history. You will see the oldest Lutheran church in Mt. Meru, visit a primary or secondary school, and as you walk to the farm you will see small shambas (farms), where people grow bananas, maize, beans, and other vegetables and fruits.

The farm you will visit is also the coffee nursery and you will learn and see the difference between organic and traditional coffee farming and see how coffee is grown from young trees to when it is picked.





After walking down to the point of start, you are invited to a big Tanzanian lunch in the garden. You can taste chapatti, ugali, roasted banana, rice, spinach, salad, goat meat, and fresh fruit of the season, however, this is optional.

The last stop is the coffee roasting factory. Here, you can taste freshly roasted coffee while you see the process of roasting and grinding coffee. You will get a free bag of your favorite coffee bag to bring home, and there are other souvenirs from Tanzania.

Arusha City Tour from \$50





Start the day by meeting your local guide at the hotel. After a short briefing, you will walk to the Clock Tower, which is a central landmark and an excellent meeting point.

Begin your food market tour at the Central Market, also known as Soko Kuu. This bustling market is the heart of Arusha's trade and offers a vibrant array of fresh produce. spices, meats and more. Your guide can introduce you to various local vendors and explain the cultural significance of the different ingredients.

Visit the spice stalls to discover the aromatic spices that play a crucial role in Tanzanian cuisine. Learn about the common spices used in local dishes and perhaps purchase some to take home.

After exploring the local market, head to the Cultural Heritage Centre to explore Tanzanian art and cultural exhibits. Your guide can highlight specific pieces and share stories behind the artwork.

After exploring the cultural heritage, your guide will take you to a local restaurant called Themi Living Garden, it is a woman-run-co-op where you can enjoy authentic



Tanzanian cuisine. This is an excellent opportunity to try nyama choma, ugali, or any other local dishes.

After a delicious lunch, you will head towards the Maasai Market with your guide. Learn about the traditional Maasai crafts, beadwork and clothing. Your guide can offer insights into the significance of Maasai culture.

Conclude your Arusha City Tour with your guide returning you to your hotel, bringing your vibrant and culture-immersive day to a close.

Walking Safari • from \$175 in Arusha National Park



Arusha National Park is a perfect trip for day safaris, as it is close to both Arusha and Moshi. With terrain that ranges from open savannah to tropical rainforest, the park is dominated by the shadow of Mt. Meru - whose summit offers an unparalleled view of Mt. Kilimanjaro.

You'll start the Day with a short drive to Arusha National Park, which will take about 30 minutes. From here we'll start driving through the beautiful green surroundings of Arusha National Park to spot some local wildlife. All this with a stunning view of Mt. Meru as the backdrop.

After, your local safari ranger will take you on a walking safari. The walking safari gives you a whole new and unique perspective of the national park - the scents and sounds of the African bush are best experienced by foot. Here you'll be walking alongside wild, freely roaming animals in their natural habitat. Apart from sharing their knowledge about the animals you will encounter, your guide will also tell you all about the unique flora & fauna of Arusha National Park.



During the walking safari, you will also visit other sites, such as the impressive waterfall that hides in the heart of the park, the Ngurdoto Crater, and Lake Momella, where thousands of pink flamingos can often be spotted.





Tarangire National Park from \$200



This morning you will be picked up by your private Sarafika Tours guide from your hotel. He will take you to Tarangire National Park (approximately a 2 hour drive from Arusha) for a game drive.

Once you've entered Tarangire, you'll begin your game drive across a rich vista of endless golden savannah that surrounds the Tarangire River. The river itself runs throughout the year and is a vital source of water for the animals of the region during the dry season. Lined with acacia and Baobab trees, the river is regularly visited by the park's large elephant population as well as other herbivores such as zebras and antelopes.





Enjoy a hot picnic lunch with a view of the river, but be sure to stay alert, as the local monkey population is not shy and would like to share your food!

Driving through the park you'll also have the opportunity to see lions, leopards, cape buffalo, and antelopes. If you're particularly lucky, you might even see endangered animals such as the Greater Kudu or the Fringe-Eared Oryx.

After the fantastic game, your guide will bring you back to Arusha

Kilimanjaro Day Hike from \$180





This one-day hike to Mandara Hut (the first stage of the Marangu Route) is the perfect way to experience a small part of Mount Kilimanjaro. If you don't have the desire, the time, or the confidence to summit the mountain then this one-day hike will be the best option for you.

Scenic Drive: Your journey begins with a scenic drive from Arusha to Moshi, offering stunning views of the Tanzanian countryside and the chance to glimpse daily life in the region.

Tropical Rainforest: The hike starts in the lush, green rainforest zone. Enjoy the vibrant flora and fauna, including towering trees, exotic birds, and playful monkeys.

Cultural Insights: Learn about the Chagga people, the indigenous inhabitants of the Kilimanjaro region, and their traditional practices. Your guide will share insights into the local culture and history.

Nature and Wildlife: Keep an eye out for Kilimanjaro's unique wildlife, including colobus monkeys, duikers, and a variety of bird species. The diverse ecosystems along the trail offer a chance to spot the region's rich biodiversity.



Acclimatisation: This day hike also serves as a valuable acclimatisation experience for those considering a longer trek to Kilimanjaro's summit. It helps your body adjust to higher altitudes, reducing the risk of altitude sickness.

Arusha City from \$250 To Ngorongoro Crater

You'll depart from Arusha for the long but beautiful drive to the Ngorongoro Conservation Area. Along the way, you'll pass bustling Maasai villages and sweeping plains dotted with acacia and the occasional giraffe or wildebeest.

Upon arrival at the park, you'll sign in and then begin the winding descent into the caldera. The mist-shrouded rainforests of the mountain are home to cape buffalo and baboon troupes, and the particularly lucky might even spot a grazing elephant or a shy leopard moving through the dense green undergrowth.

You'll stop at the Ngorongoro viewing area for a stunning view of the caldera's sheer scale. The shadows of clouds dapple the caldera floor, and the keen-eyed might spot the great herds of wildebeest and zebra moving about below.

The sun glitters off the soda lakes and it all combines to make for a truly beautiful landscape. From here you'll continue our descent into the caldera, where over 120 species of mammals go about their lives.





The park is the best place in the northern circuit to see the black rhinoceros and the cape buffalo but is home to the entirety of the Big Five. We'll also see large packs of hyenas as well as lesser-known predators such as jackals and serval cats. Across five to six hours, you'll see the very best that Africa has to offer. In the late afternoon, with heads full of amazing memories, you'll return back to Arusha.
